She sings, composes, writes, performs, curates spaces, produces events, tends hearth-fires, tells stories, and documents aliveness. Born in New York City, she now calls Washington State's rural north Olympic Peninsula, traditional Coast Salish lands, home. An award-winning vocalist and performing songwriter, Judith-Kate is a three-time recipient of National Endowment for the Arts grants for her Songwriting Works social practice projects.
